#1 Pacifism. Using military language, we could examine the "chain of command" of Jesus Christ. Jesus said to forgive our enemies, love our enemies, pray for our enemies, turn the other cheek, and return good for evil. Jesus forgave his enemies while they were killing him. Then Jesus died for his enemies. The primary symbol of Christianity is Jesus tortured with a crown of thorns, a spear wound in his side, nails in his hands and feet, in death convulsions on the Cross. The theme is "redemptive suffering." Jesus' chain of command is some form of "pacifism"? Conforming to this pacifism of Jesus, youth who are Quakers, Mennonites, and Brethren are expected to profess conscientious objection to compulsory military drafts.

#2 Sharing the Blame. An email from a Buddhist clergy friend defined "talk that leads to war," and "talk that leads to peace." Claiming that our enemy, Putin, is 100% evil and that we, Americans, Ukrainians, and NATO, are 100% good, is "talk that leads to war." Claiming that Putin is 50% good and 50% evil -- and that we are 50% good and 50% evil is "talk that leads to peace."

Then there is the much acclaimed credo of Will Rogers, "I never met a man I didn't like." What planet is Will Rogers from? We on Earth have already met Atilla the Hun, Hitler, and Stalin. Ukrainians have now met Putin.

#3 Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Bonhoeffer was executed by hanging as an enemy of the state on April 9, 1945, at the Flossenbürg concentration camp in Germany. Ignoring the "pacifist" chain of command of Christ, Bonhoeffer recognized evil when he saw it. He was one of the key conspirators in a failed plot to assassinate Hitler. A fellow Japan missionary, Rev. Dr. Leroy Seat, wrote an essay asking, "Does Russia need more Bonhoeffers?"

#4 Personal Ethics--National Ethics. I am 90% pacifist in personal ethics. I believe the command of Jesus Christ to love my enemy, but I am bound also to love my wife, children, and nation. I might kill a maniac busting down my door in a home invasion robbery. He threatens my wife and children with an AK 47 assault rifle. **Besides loving enemies**, we should protect also the weak, the victims, the refugees, the orphans, the homeless, the dying, and prisoners. **Why must we love only our enemies?** Etched in my memory banks is a Time magazine photo of theologian, Karl Barth, in

military uniform holding a rifle to defend his nation, Switzerland, against Hitler.

President Biden and NATO reject a "no fly zone" over Ukraine. They also refuse to provide jet fighters from NATO to Ukraine, fearing the outbreak of WW3. They rely on devastating **economic sanctions** that will reduce Russia to a third rate economy within a few years. Will China interfere militarily for Russia? Will Russia use chemical, biological weapons or tactical nuclear weapons? For the first time both sides have hundreds of nuclear weapons. For the first time in a long time it is predominantly Caucasians against Caucasians--white on white. It is also Christians against Christians. The Russian Orthodox Church solidly back Putin.

Already Putin is a pariah to most of the world. What would Jesus do about Ukraine? What would Bonhoeffer do about Ukraine? What should Biden do about Ukraine? What would you do about Ukraine?

LENT AND EASTER WINNING BY LOSING

Paul Nagano was tall for a Japanese. He put that height to good use. He was outstanding in basketball. They often won, but not always. His mother was waiting whenever he came home dejected. Therapists should learn from her words: "Makeru ga kachi," translated as "winning by losing."

Some Christians are tired of grieving at Lent, tired of fasting, tired of sadness, tired of gloom. It is more fun to be happy, more fun to celebrate. Genuine Lent, genuine fasting disappeared for Christians many decades or centuries ago. As a Southern Baptist we never ever even heard of Lenten fasting. American Baptists speak of Lent as giving up some comfort for Lent. Some walk instead of ride the bus so they could donate the bus fare to the poor. The ministerial staff of one Baptist church declared that they would give up eating red meat. Is that convincing as Lenten substitute for fasting?

It is such a contrast to see the enthusiasm of Muslims doing the real thing--fasting at the month of Ramadan. You can feel their pain at fasting. But you can also see the joy of their faith in their fasting. It is the joy of marathon runners feeling the extremities of their zeal in their runs. One blessing of the fast is the deepening of group morale of Muslim congregations. Of course, Muslims are human, too. Imams scold their congregations for enthusiastic feasting celebrations after fasting hours. Human nature comes through also when Lenten fast is preceded by Mardi Gra celebrations in New Orleans and the wild dancing Carnival parades in Rio de Janeiro.

Lent is losing; Jesus died. **Easter is winning**; Jesus rose again. But Easter Resurrection is not the **Victory of Victory**; it is the **Victory of Defeat**. In the Book of Revelations, the last Book of the Bible, our champion hero Jesus is forever the **Lamb Who Was Slain**. The message is **Redemptive Suffering**. The God of the Bible, the God of the Cross, is the God for Losers. Our God is weird. God chose Jewish slaves instead of their Egyptian slave masters. The God of the Bible is a **God for Losers**. The message is "Makeru ga kachi", "Winning by Losing." **No Easter without Lent**.

SHALL WE GATHER: ASIAN AMERICAN BUDDHIST HATE

On March 16, 2021, there was a killing of six Asian women in the Atlanta area. A year later on May 4, 2021, there was a huge gathering of Asian Buddhist clergy, both monks and nuns, of multiple nationalities. It was perhaps the first effort to gather all Asian Buddhists in a united service. It was 49 days (7 weeks of 7 days) after death, the established date when spirits of the departed proceed out of Bardo on the route toward rebirth.

It was a joint memorial service for the six women, but more so a service of healing for all Asian Buddhists in the centuries of insults, prejudices, ostracisms, and exclusionary laws, including 10 desert concentration camps of WW2. They gathered in Higashi Honganji Headquarters temple, in Little Tokyo, Los Angeles, recently vandalized in a hate crime.

For Caucasians of the dominant American class and blacks of long generations as **insiders** of American history, it was a rare intimate look at Asian **outsiders**—the red, orange, brown, and black robes of priests bowing with palms together in clouds of incense. They were chanting the Heart Sutra in Korean. But for older Asians like me, it was startling to see intimate Buddhist Brotherhood among Chinese, Koreans, Taiwanese, and Burmese victims of the brutal Japanese Imperial Army of WW2.

Now I saw with my own eyes that Japanese were accepted as brothers in the Buddhist Brotherhood. This must have been true for many decades, but this was a first large gathering of Asian Buddhists. So I saw this intimate brotherhood for the very first time, bringing tears to my eyes. Chinese, Koreans, and Japanese as Buddhist Brothers--this had been my prayer for 31 years in Japan.

The photo above shows a woman priest bowing before a white broken ceramic lotus. Each priest dipped a brush into gold lacquer to paint over the cracks. After multiple brush strokes of golden lacquer, the broken lotus has healed stronger and more beautiful than before. This restoration process in Japan is called *kintsugi*--rejoining with gold. It was a central ritual in this ceremony to prophesy the healing of all wounds in the social maturing of all races, cultures, and religions in the communal America of tomorrow. May it be so.

Award Citation

For 30 years, Dr. Tetsu Nakamura has devoted himself to the medical treatment, land reclamation and local welfare of poor and vulnerable people in Pakistan and Afghanistan. His thoughts, speeches and written work based on his first-hand experiences in those countries aim at enhancing cross-cultural understanding and respecting different cultures. His work has been highly praised internationally as providing an intellectual basis for building genuine peace.

Dr. Nakamura was born in Fukuoka City in 1946. After graduating from Kyushu University School of Medicine in 1973, he worked as a medical doctor in hospitals in Japan. In 1984, he moved to **Peshawar Mission Hospital** in the capital city of North-West Frontier Province of **Pakistan**. Ever since, starting with leprosy and intestinal infectious diseases which are common among the poor, he has widened his working sphere even to refugee camps and villages in the mountains (Medicine Beyond Borders).

He was also involved in **digging 1,600 wells** in Afghanistan in order to tackle droughts which have happened with increasing frequency since the beginning of this century (**A Doctor Digs Wells**), and in building a **25.5 km canal** to carry water from the Kunar River (**A Doctor Builds an Irrigation Canal**).

Approximately 15,000 ha of farm land has been recovered or newly reclaimed. Irrigation construction work has produced employment opportunities which have encouraged refugees to come home, and **rehabilitation of their farm land** has enabled them to regain their peaceful farming life. The number of people benefitted is estimated at **over half a million**... **By Dickson Kazuo Wagi**

ANOTHER SAMURAI CHRISTIAN: REV. KOICHI KIMURA

Do you remember the desperate month preceding the U. S. air bombing of Bagdad in 2003? Our entire nation led by President George W. Bush boiled in rage after the 9-11 attacks on the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York City. Much of the nation was in revenge rage, but cooler heads were also desperately trying to prevent the horrors of another war. Bush transferred the revenge target from Afghanistan to Saddam Hussein's Iraq.

The Los Angeles City Council and numerous other city councils had voted against the Bagdad bombing and "pre-emptive invasion" of Iraq. The monstrous lie of President Bush and Secretary of State Colin Powell argued that Saddam Hussein was ready to launch an attack of WMD (Weapons of Mass Destruction) on allies of the U.S. The UN's investigation report had concluded there was no weapons of mass destruction. Bush's strategy won when the much-trusted Sec. of State, Colin Powell made a convincing speech about the imminent use of "weapons of mass destruction" by Hussein. That tipped the scales of U. S. public opinion for the "Shock and Awe" invasion of Iraq.

Residents of Pilgrim Place retirement community led by WW2 veteran, Jim Lamb, had organized a team of peace protestors holding huge anti-war signs at the four corners of Indian Hill and Arrow, a major intersection of Claremont, CA. (They still stand there today weekly in 2022 holding their peace signs.)

Tom Ambrogi was our brilliant social justice theologian and unflinching resident activist. A Roman Catholic scholar, he wrote the Pope, pleading that the Pope move temporarily to live in Bagdad as a volunteer hostage for peace. That is, U.S. pilots and crew may refuse to bomb Bagdad if the Pope had moved to live there. There was no response from the Pope.

But guess what! Rev. Koichi Kimura, a graduate of Seinan Gakuin University Theology Department, and pastor of an international church in Fukuoka, moved to Bagdad in 2003 as a volunteer hostage. It would discourage U.S. bomber crews dropping bombs on Bagdad if they knew international volunteer hostages were there.

His wife in Japan sent out email weekly news reports from Rev. Kimura. One report said that Bagdad shop keepers would not let him pay when they found out he was a volunteer hostage risking his life for them. A genuine Samurai warrior for Jesus. Some 20 years later in 2022, guess what! Rev. Koichi Kimura dropped whatever he was doing and moved to Poland to help war refugees from Ukraine in desperate survival conditions. I knew Rev. Kimura while teaching at Seinan Gakuin University. He attended several meetings of our Buddhist Christian Dialogue.
